

Supporting people living with HIV

We pledge to continue supporting people living with HIV, as we have done for the last forty years. With your support during 2024, we've continued to achieve historic wins to support people living with HIV, and focused on the needs of an ageing population living with HIV.

THT Direct helpline – a lifeline

Last year, we had over **12,951 enquiries** to our confidential free helpline THT Direct, covering subjects such as information on HIV and symptoms, HIV testing, and PrEP and PEP.

Growing older with HIV

In 2024, we launched a **new programme** for people over 50 living with HIV, and developed a new Social Care training programme co-produced with people living with HIV, to deliver **accessible and bitesized training**.

Our impact across the UK

On World AIDS Day 2024, the Scottish First Minister acknowledged the impact of last year's **anti-stigma campaign** and announced funding for additional training to increase HIV awareness and reduce stigma among health and social care staff.

In December 2024, we recruited a peer support coordinator for Wales and began co-production and relationship building with clinics in Wales. We launched a new, fully bilingual **Terrence Higgins Trust Cymru website** and updated our materials in the Welsh language.

Specialist support

We continue to offer in-person and online support groups for people living with HIV, including: **Before96** – for those diagnosed before 1996; **Common Bond**, our inclusive online group for women; and **B+**, our newest online group, providing space for those newly diagnosed or who are accessing our services for the first time.

My Community

In September 2024, we launched our newest version of My Community, a **safe space** for people living with HIV to connect. The site now has over **500 new members**.

Fighting stigma



Thanks to you, we can work to end HIV stigma and challenge the inequalities faced every day by people living with HIV.

User-led stories changing hearts and minds

Our **Positive Voices** programme trains people living with HIV to provide informative talks to education, corporate, public sector and other audiences.

The programme is a great way for people living with HIV to build the confidence to tell their own **stories** and to **educate** others about HIV and stigma in a range of community settings.

Meanwhile, the **Ambassador Programme** educates the health and care sector in London about HIV

stigma, with people living with HIV acting as ambassadors.

Preparing for change and ending an epidemic

Over the last financial year, we have made significant progress in transforming the lives of people living with HIV.

We answered nearly **13,000 enquiries** through our THT Direct helpline, successfully campaigned to remove out-dated rules used by the DVLA, launched our new version of **My Community**, an online space for people living with HIV to connect with each other, and gave a record number of **Positive Voices and HIV Ambassador** talks to help end HIV stigma.

Our advocacy work helped secure **£27 million** in new funding to continue NHS England's opt-out HIV testing in **89 hospitals** for another year, and expand it to **nine new hospitals**, to find people living with undiagnosed HIV and ensure that they are getting the care they need.

With unrestricted funds and partnerships, we have pressed for progress on the **Welsh government's HIV Action Plan** and **expanded our HIV services in Scotland**.

The **"Stigma is more harmful than HIV"** TV campaign was broadcast in Scotland, and was the first campaign about HIV since the 1980s. The adverts, which were viewed by millions, highlighted the stigma faced by those living with HIV and the effectiveness of modern treatment.

Ahead of the UK general election, we campaigned with partners across the HIV sector to put HIV on the new government's agenda. Thanks to our campaigning, the government commissioned a **new HIV Action Plan for England** within weeks.

In a difficult financial environment for charities, including austerity and inflation, together we focused the organisation on HIV and secured additional funding. We are eternally grateful to you, our supporters, who allow us to continue supporting people living with HIV.


We are committed to prioritising work on HIV, **ending new HIV cases in the UK** by 2030.

Our year in numbers

Across 2024, you have raised an incredible amount of funds which has made such a difference to the lives of people living with HIV. To all our supporters, we can only say a heartfelt thank you.


Here are just some of the ways **you** have made change happen:

We answered **12,951 enquiries** to our free THT Direct helpline.

Over **5,700 tests** were distributed to those who needed to access a HIV self test kit.

We've covered the costs of **500 people** living with HIV to access **My Community**, our online safe space, for free.

Over **21,100 people** were reached through **278 Positive Voices sessions** in a record-breaking year for our Positive Voices speakers programme.




Financial Review for 2023/2024

£3.8m on supporting people living with HIV

Ending stigma and giving people living with HIV a voice through our support services and groups, whilst remembering those lost to HIV.

Ending new cases of HIV by 2030



It's possible for us to end new cases of HIV in the UK by 2030, and to become the first country in the world to do so.

If we achieve this, it would be the first time in history the onward transmission of any virus has been stopped without a vaccine or cure.

Finding people not engaging in HIV care

We have started a new **Lost to Care** programme in London, to find thousands of people who are living with HIV but are not accessing treatment. People who aren't on effective treatment can pass on HIV.

Now, we are calling for national funding of an **HIV Retention England programme** and its equivalent in Scotland and Wales.

Unblocking access to PrEP

Currently PrEP can only be prescribed by sexual health clinics, which are often overstretched. In some areas, people have to wait up to 12 weeks to access PrEP, creating a **postcode lottery** of this effective HIV prevention medication.

In 2024, we continued our work to call for PrEP to be made available through an **online tool**, in community pharmacies, and for those in prison.

Our team in Brighton are showing the way, working with partners on a community-based PrEP clinic and an app that allows people to manage their prescriptions.

Our free HIV self testing kit service

Between April 2023 and December 2024, we distributed **over 5,700 HIV self testing kits** to those in need.
